Endemismi italiani – 49 F. Collepardo Coccia. *Italopodisma trapezoidalis* (La Greca, 1966) (Orthoptera, Catantopidae)...I-II

Fabio Collepardo Coccia - Contribution to the knowledge of vernacular names of insects and other animals from Ciociaria (Southern Latium).

This work is based on the desire to preserve the heritage of naturalistic knowledge that the populations of Ciociaria (Southern Latium), mainly agricultural, have gathered during the centuries. The vernacular classification of fauna, as highlighted by some of the terms, is the expected result of an intimate bond between nature and the contextual rural populations.

Gianni Gobbi - Preliminary remarks on xylofagous coleopterofauna of surviving ash-forest of Lessini (Etolia, Greece) (Coleoptera Buprestidae; Cerambycidae).

The wooded biotope near Lessini (Greece NW) is one of the last still existing along the Mediterranean coasts. Though protection by Ramsar Convention, really this biotope need urgent intervention for its effective conservation. In this note the first data on Coleoptera Buprestidae and Cerambycidae living in this wood are analysed, and the presence of some interesting species, as *Scintillatrix solieri*, *Prionus besicanus*, *Corymbia rufa*, *Purpuricenus globulicollis* and *Rosalia alpina*, is commented. Finally, this data with the corresponded available for Policoro wood (South Italy, Matera prov.) are compared to give prominence and to comment analogies and differences.

Guido Pedroni - Annotated catalogue of the *Dichotrachelus* and *Tropiphorus* in the Fiori collection housed in Bologna, with description of *Tropiphorus fiorii* n. sp. (Coleoptera, Curculionidae).

Are listed 12 species of the montane weevil genera *Dichotrachelus* Stierlin, 1853 (39 specimens), and 11 species of *Tropiphorus* Schoenherr, 1842 (43 specimens) in the part of the Andrea Fiori collection housed in Bologna, Italy. One of them, *Tropiphorus fiorii* n. sp. is described upon a single specimen from the northern Appennines at the border between Tuscany and Emilia and compared to the closely similar *T. bertolinii* Stierlin, 1894 from northern Italy. *Tropiphorus fiorii* is possibly an endemic species of northern Appennines.

Fernanda Cianficconi, Piero Salerno e Francesco Tucciarelli - Trichopteran fauna on Monte Subasio (Umbria, Italy) (Trichoptera).

The first list of Trichoptera in lotic waters on Monte Subasio is reported. The research was carried out from 1968 to 1996 by 10 researchers in 54 sampling stations located on the western and eastern slopes of Monte Subasio at between 320 and 1016 m a.s.l. These included hygropetric habitats, unmodified springs, springs channelled into pipes and troughs, springs brooks and one stream (Torrente Chiona). Only 23 stations (19 on the eastern slope, 4 on the western slope) were inhabited by Trichoptera. No Trichoptera were found in the 31 biotopes (21 on the western slope, 10 on the eastern slope) modified either by man (eg. To different claning of the substrate and capture for aqueducts) or by natural phenomena (eg. Periodic lack of water or pollution). A total of 30 species and 4 subspecies from 24 genera and 13 families were found in 165 samplings. The coexistence of diversified habitats in these lotic waters favours the presence of species with different ecological

needs and belonging to different chorological categories. *Plectrocnemia geniculata* ssp. may belong to a new subspecies endemic to central Italy.

Manuela Pinzari, Mario Pinzari e Alberto Zilli - New data on Italian Tortricidae (Lepidoptera).

The paper deals about records of Lepidoptera Tortricidae new to at least some administrative regions in Italy. 167 species are dealt with as a whole, two of which new to Italy, namely *Phtheochroa reisseri* (Razowski, 1970) and *Cydia conicolana* (Heylaerts, 1874), from Abruzzi and Lazio, respectively, a further 30 species are newly recorded from Central Italy, and another 2 from Southern Italy.
